#### **Purpose**

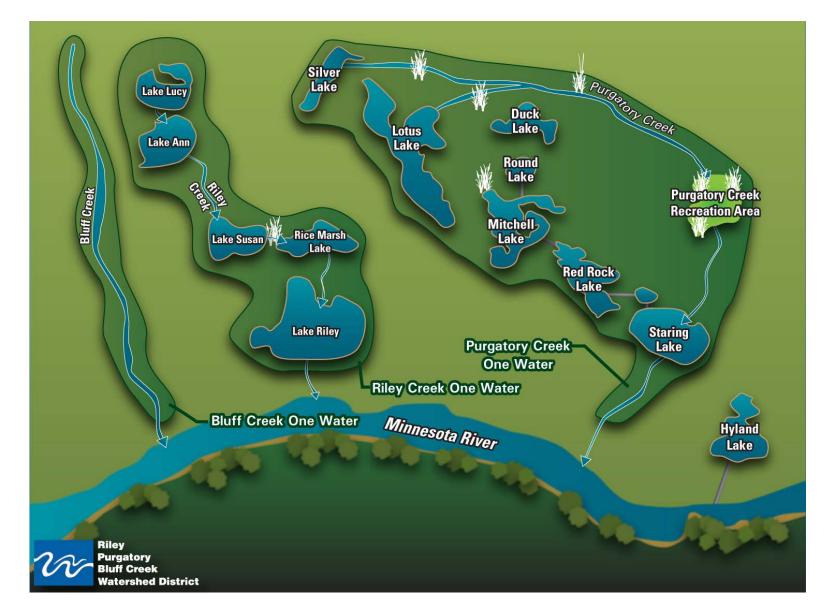

#### Why care about Mitchell Lake?

Mitchell Lake is an important asset to your home and our community. Excessive nutrients in the lake from urban runoff increase the growth of algae and aquatic weeds resulting in costly cleanup measures, the loss of the lake for recreational activities, and lower property values for lakeside homes.

"Quick-fix" solutions like chemical treatment and weed harvesting are expensive and often ineffective. Once a lake is degraded, it can take years to recover.



This brochure outlines several simple things you can do now to help improve the water quality of Mitchell Lake.

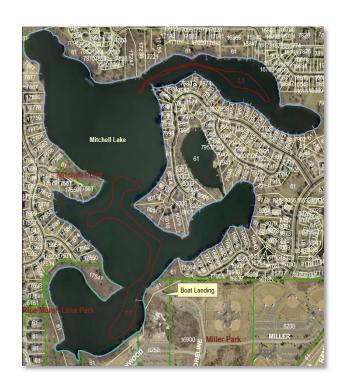

- 1st update since 2008 Bylaw release
- Change Summary:
  - Restructured format to simplify
  - Updated Association Purpose to include education and government advocacy roles
  - Removed membership restriction
  - Simplified member voting eligibility
  - Removed annual schedule restriction
  - Updated Board of Directors section to: remove geographic restrictions, add flexibility in number of board members, and open board member nomination process



#### **Current Bylaws**

**NAME** - This organization shall be called the Mitchell Lake Association, hereinafter the "Association."

STATUTES AND LIMITATIONS - To carry out the program of the Association and to make effective representations on behalf of its members, the Association shall be organized as a non-profit, non-stock corporation under Minn. Stat. § 317A, Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act, and 501(c)(3) IRS publication 557. No asset of the association shall benefit any officer or member. The Association shall not participate in partisan political activity.

PURPOSE - The purpose of the Association is to create awareness, knowledge and appropriate actions with property owners, local government and community agencies to enhance the water quality and thereby the boating, fishing and aesthetic values of Mitchell Lake, as a recreational facility for today and for future generations.

#### **Proposed Changes**

NAME - This organization shall be called the Mitchell Lake Association, hereinafter the "Association." The Association shall be an entity in accordance with the State of Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 317A known as the Minnesota Non-Profit Corporation Act, and Section 501(c)(4) of the United States Revenue Code. ### **PURPOSE -** The purpose of the Association is:

- To maintain, protect, and improve the water quality, aesthetic values, wildlife habitat, and recreational capacity of Mitchell Lake;
- To educate shoreline owners and the public about the condition and protection of Mitchell Lake; and
- To provide a framework for representation for work with federal, state, and local agencies for improving quality of Mitchell Lake

MEMBERSHIP - Membership in the Association shall be open to any individual, family, business, or organization, that (a) subscribes to the purposes of the Association and (b) owns or leases property in the vicinity of the lake. RESIDENCE AND VOTING Eligibility — Only those members of the Association who are 18 years or older and are in good standing and live within the recognized Home Owners Associations which boarder Mitchell Lake or whose property adjoins the lake, or those who have property on either side of a road which runs parallel to the lake, will be considered voting members of the Association. Minn. Stat. § 317A 401 (See attached address list.) Voting — Each address will be entitled to one vote.	VOTING -Each address with a paid membership will be entitled to one vote.	Simplified voting eligibility



#### **Current Bylaws**

ANNUAL MEETINGS - The annual meeting of the Association shall be held on the third Tuesday of September. The time and place shall be arranged by the Board of Directors unless specified by the previous annual meeting. The agenda of the annual meeting shall include elections, report on the activities and financial condition of the Association, discussion of projects, adoption of a budget, member concerns, and an educational program. Minn. Stat. § 317A.431

#### **Proposed Changes**

ANNUAL MEETINGS - The annual meeting of the Association shall be held in the month of September. The time and place shall be arranged by the Board of Directors. The agenda of the annual meeting shall include elections, report on the activities and financial condition of the Association, discussion of projects, adoption of a budget, member concerns, and an educational program. Minn. Stat. § 317A.431

### Rationale

Removed schedule restriction to allow more flexibility

NOTIFICATION - Every annual or special meeting must be preceded by notice to paid members and members from the preceding year who have not yet renewed their membership. Notification may be by hand delivery or by mail at least 30 days, but not more than 50, prior to annual meetings and at least 15 days, but not more than 50, prior to special meetings. The notice shall summarize any proposed changes in the Bylaws, shall highlight any proposals to dissolve the Association, and may include a detailed agenda.

NOTIFICATION - Every annual or special meeting must be preceded by notice to paid members and members from the preceding year who have not yet renewed their membership. Notification may be by hand delivery, email or by postal mail at least 30 days, prior to annual meetings and at least 15 days, prior to special meetings. The notice shall summarize any proposed changes in the Bylaws, shall highlight any proposals to dissolve the Association, and may include a detailed agenda.

#### **Current Bylaws**

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

COMPOSITION - One representative from each home owners association (8) to be determined by those associations; if a candidate is not presented by a home owners association then an at large representative may be elected. One additional at large representative to be elected at the annual meeting. From these 9 representatives they will choose among themselves, who will serve in the following positions:

- A. One President.
- B. One Vice-President.
- C. One Secretary.
- D. One Treasurer.

election - The Board of Directors shall nominate one or more members for each vacant position on the Board. Additional nominations of members, present at the annual meeting and willing to serve, shall be taken from the floor. All elections for the Board shall be conducted by secret, written ballot.

#### **Proposed Changes**

**BOARD OF DIRECTORS** 

**COMPOSITION** - The board shall have up to nine (9), but no fewer than five (5) members. From these representatives they will choose among themselves, who will serve in the following positions:

- A. One President.
- B. One Vice-President.
- C. One Secretary.
- D. One Treasurer.

ELECTION – Current Association members may nominate one or more members for vacant board positions prior to annual meeting. Additional nominations of members, present at the annual meeting and willing to serve, shall be taken from the floor. All elections for the Board shall be conducted by written ballot or voice vote if number of nominations is less than number of vacant positions.

#### **Current Bylaws**

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS (cont)**

TERMS OF OFFICE - Directors are elected for three-year terms. Their terms shall expire after the annual meeting or upon the election of new Directors, whichever occurs later. Therefore three offices expire each year.

**BOARD MEETINGS** - The new Board shall meet within 60 days of the annual meeting and at least three other times prior to the next annual meeting. Regular meetings shall be held at places, dates, and times established by the Board. Special meetings may be held on the call of the President or any three Directors after at least 24 hours notice by telephone, fax, mail, electronic communication or personal contact. Four directors shall constitute a guorum for the transaction of business. The meetings shall be open to the members. Decisions shall be made by majority vote of directors present, with the President voting only to break ties. Between meetings, the President may solicit decisions from the Board through written communications as provide by Minnesota 317A.239.

#### **Proposed Changes**

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS (cont)**

TERMS OF OFFICE - Directors are elected for three-year terms. Their terms shall expire after the annual meeting or upon the election of new Directors, whichever occurs later.

**BOARD MEETINGS** - The new Board shall meet within 60 days of the annual meeting and at least three other times prior to the next annual meeting. Regular meetings shall be held at places, dates, and times established by the Board. Fifty percent of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The meetings shall be open to the members. Decisions shall be made by majority vote of directors present. Between meetings, the President may solicit decisions from the Board through written communications as provided by Minnesota 317A.239.

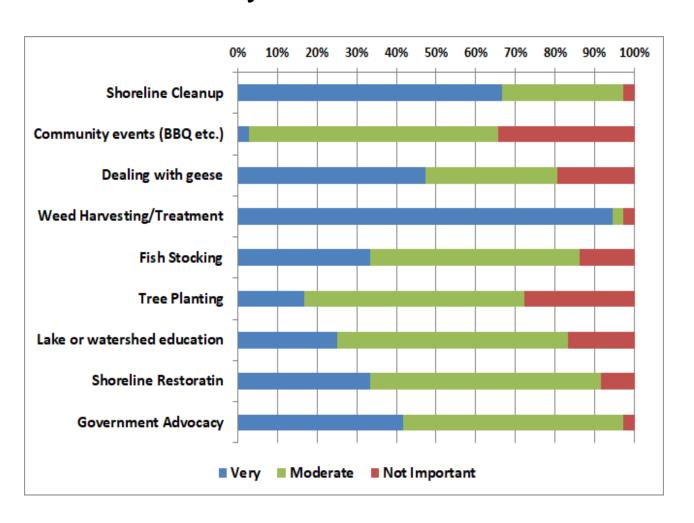
