

### MLA Purpose

- To maintain, protect, and improve the water quality, aesthetic values, wildlife habitat, and recreational capacity of Mitchell Lake;
- To educate shoreline owners and the public about the condition and protection of Mitchell Lake; and
- To provide a framework for representation for work with federal, state, and local agencies for improving quality of Mitchell Lake

  - Other local lake associations (Riley, Lotus etc.)



### Over the Years...

- Water quality improved and lake removed from impaired waters list
- 14 lakeshore cleanup events
- \$33,000 DNR lakeshore restoration grant
  - >1,000 ft of lakeshore restored
- Planted >100 trees along Hwy 5
- Built community through fun events (BBQ etc.)
- Hosted water stewardship training events
- Monitored lake water and invasive species
- Advocated with City and Watershed














### Mitchell Lake Water Quality

- Thanks to the efforts of MLA, RPBCWD & City of EP, Mitchell Lake water quality levels have improved over the past several years.
  - Lake was added to the MPCA impaired waters list in 2002
  - In 2018, Mitchell Lake was removed from the MPCA impaired waters list and is now classified as a "Healthy/Shallow Lake"
  - Latest MCES water quality at Grade C based on phosphorus, chlorophyll and water clarity measurements






#### Mitchell Lake Water quality graphs 1972 - 2019


Red lines mark the MPCA standards

The goal is to be below the red line






Phosphorus is a nutrient that plants and algae need for growth. It is often measured as total phosphorus (TP). Too much phosphorous can cause algae blooms.



Chlorophyll a is the main pigment in algae, so measuring chi-a can tell us how much algae there is. Too much chi-a means that there are too many nutrients in the water.



#### Water clarity

is measured using a Secchi Disk, a black and white disk the size of a dinner plate. It is lowered into the water, and the depth at which it is no longer visible is recorded.




### 2020 Objectives

# Weed Management




#### **Weed Harvesting**

- In June of 2020, the City of EP contracted a weed harvester to harvest 8 acres.
- 12 residents participated and received \$100 MLA rebates





### Weed Management 2020





**Green dots** represent locations sampled for curly-leaf pondweed

Yellow lines represent treatment areas

#### **Herbicide Treatment**

- In May of 2020, the RPBCWD applied herbicide to 13 acres of Mitchell Lake targeting the invasive curly-leaf pondweed.
- Herbicide treatment for submerged plants is restricted since Mitchell Lake is classified as a Natural Environment Lake by the DNR.
- DNR approved homeowner herbicide permits for algae but not for submersed plants.
- MLA addressing lake reclassification opportunities.



# **Invasive Species** 2020

#### Adopt-a-dock

- In 2020, four Mitchell Lake residents participated in the Adopt-a-dock program.
- Dock plates are hung on end of dock are monitored and recorded monthly.
- No zebra mussels detected in 2020 and we hope to keep it that way.



  - 2019 funding: \$1000 from MLA and \$920 from voluntary contributions
  - 2020 funding: \$1912 from voluntary contributions (\$1750 spent)






# MLA 2020 Survey Results

36 responses to our annual survey


How long have you lived on or near Mitchell Lake?
