#### 2021 Highlights

We had another great year in 2021. MLA supported efforts and events included:

- Vegetation management: Coordinated with watershed district and City of EP to treat invasive weeds via herbicide treatment and weed harvesting.
- Invasive species: Continued monitoring thanks to the vigilance of our members.
- Fish stocking: Added 150 crappies and 20 bass, thanks to voluntary contributions.

The purpose of the Association is to:

- Maintain, protect, and improve the water quality, aesthetic values, wildlife habitat and recreational capacity of Mitchell Lake,
- Educate shoreline owners and the public about the condition and protection of Mitchell Lake, and
- Provide a framework for representation for work with federal, state, and local agencies for improving the quality of Mitchell Lake.



# Protect our Lake – Stop Aquatic Invasive Species

Aquatic invasive species (AIS) can cause irreparable damage to native fish and plant populations affecting lake recreation, human health, property values, and the economy. Here are some ways to protect our lake:

- Become an Adopt-a-Dock Volunteer Volunteers attach monitoring plates to
  the end of their docks, check them once a month and record observations to aid in
  early detection of zebra mussels. In 2021, Mitchell Lake had three participants
  with no zebra mussels detected. To participate in 2022,
  contact <a href="mailto:EMahon@rpbcwd.org">EMahon@rpbcwd.org</a>.
- Prevent the Spread Clean all aquatic plants, animals and mud from watercraft, trailers, docks, lifts, anchors, and other recreational equipment before leaving the lake. Mitchell Lake now has a cleaning station installed at our public boat launch.
  - **NEW:** Join your Mitchell Lake neighbors, and take the 'Lake Pledge' to prevent aquatic invasive species

We just launched the Lake Pledge program for Mitchell Lake along with several other Hennepin County Lakes. Lake Pledge is a fun, free program with entertaining videos showing how we can protect our lake from Aquatic invasive species (AIS).



### **Goose Management**

Are geese a nuisance in your part of the lake? To have geese removed from your property, file a goose complaint with the City of Eden Prairie. Go to EdenPrairie.org and search for "goose management" or scan the QR code for the form.



There is a limited window of time when geese can be dealt with, so we recommend submitting requests the last week of April through the first week of May.



### **Weed Management: Our Top Priority**



Weeds continue to the number one MLA concern. Over-abundant vegetation impacts navigation, swimming and aesthetics. Mitchell Lake is home to over 15 species of aquatic plants, most of which are native species.

- Native species are an essential part of our lake's ecosystem. They provide habitat for fish and wildlife and help improve water clarity.
- Invasive species are not native and can cause problems. They can spread rapidly, can cause environmental harm, impact wildlife and interfere with boating and swimming.

Mitchell Lake Board members interact regularly with Riley Purgatory Bluff Creek watershed and City of EP personnel to ensure that appropriate Mitchell Lake aquatic vegetations plans, issues and actions are being addressed. The two primary methods to control the invasive weeds in our lake: herbicide and weed harvesting;

- Herbicide: The Watershed District plans to treat about 15 percent of the lake with herbicide this spring.
- **Harvesting:** Mitchell Lake weed harvesting is planned for July/August. We offer a \$100 rebate to MLA members for private shoreline harvesting. Notifications will be sent to those on our email list.

### **Landscape for Water Quality**





Installing a rain garden or shoreline buffer can improve the quality of our lake by capturing pollutants, mitigating erosion and providing a better wildlife habitat.

**Financial assistance is available!** Financial help with shoreline projects is available through the City of Eden Prairie, the RPBCWD Watershed District and Mitchell Lake Association.

MLA offers a **\$250 supplemental rebate** to paid MLA members who complete a Riley Purgatory Bluff Creek Watershed District (RPBCWD) or City of EP-approved shoreline restoration, rain garden or buckthorn removal project. Four MLA restoration projects were initiated in 2021; all told, 14 projects have been completed.

#### Join Us and Adopt-a-Drain

Did you know that everything that's in the street ends up in our lake? When it rains, storm water carries debris and pollutants in the street down the storm drain system directly to our lake. Even "natural" debris such as leaves and grass clippings are a problem because they break down to become food for algae.

Many of the drains around Mitchell Lake are not adopted. Maybe the one by your house needs help! The simple act of sweeping up around a storm drain protects the water quality of our lake.

#### Dear Members,

First, let me thank all of you who have contributed toward this voluntary effort to get Mitchell Lake re-stocked and vibrant again! This would not happen without you!

For 2022 it appears we will have two fish stockings, one on April 23rd and the second this autumn due to the anticipated availability of fish. The first will be adult largemouth bass and adult black crappie. The second will be fingerling walleye 4"– 8" in length. Should the walleye be available in the Spring, we will place the order then.

The date of the shoreline cleanup is April 23rd, so we thought we would coincide the fish release for then so as many as possible can watch. Otherwise please see the fish release summary for 2019, 2020 and 2021 in the table above. Some respectable numbers!
